Our Church Links

As a Voluntary Aided Church of England School we are specifically required to:

- Have a daily act of Collective Worship that is consistent with the faith and practice of the Church of England

Reflection Spaces

We have a reflection space in each classroom. The aim of this space is to focus the children and staff on the theme for the week, and to provide a focal point for reflection, spiritual thinking and sharing ideas.

Collective Worship

The School holds a daily act of Collective Worship. Every second week we follow a main theme, which is further split into daily sessions. Worship sessions follow a clear and structured order of service.

Reserved Religious Education

Children at Longstone have the opportunity to take part in engaging, creative and interactive R.E. themed weeks. We follow the Derbyshire Agreed Syllabus for RE and teach about beliefs, culture and spiritual and moral diversity via a series of big questions.

Church Links

We are very proud of our links with St Giles's Church in Great Longstone. Visiting speakers from the church lead Collective Worship in the school on a weekly basis. All classes visit the church on the first Wednesday of every month as well as for end of term and celebratory services.
